Price Increases

As a result of the increased supply and demand around the world during COVID, many goods are in severe demand and supply is extremely limited or in many cases, nonexistent.

This has become quite evident with target load ammunition for shotguns. The club has managed to acquire some ammunition in both 12 and 20ga for the convenience of members to purchase as required and expended at the range.

This commodity is increasingly more difficult to attain and when supply is obtainable, pricing has increased dramatically. The Executive has had no choice but to increase the price per box of ammunition at the club for both members and non-member purchases.

So, effective in Aug, the price was increased as follows:

Members: \$12.00/box

Non-Members: \$15.00/box

In addition to ammunition price increase is the slow increase of targets. Therefore effective Aug 2021, the price for non-members to shoot a round of skeet/trap (25 targets) has increased to \$10.00.

Members will continue to enjoy the

benefit of paid membership and the price per round remains at \$5.00.

We thank everyone for your cooperation and understanding. The Executive will continue to monitor this situation and adjust accordingly.





