
Equipment Malfunctions

In light of a recent injury sustained to one of our members in his effort to remove a jammed piece of broken target from the machine spring loaded launch mechanism, we cannot stress enough to leave these situations to our Equipment Manager to remedy.

All of the club's trap machines are dangerous when armed at some point ready for operation and will cause serious injury if you are not trained and qualified to perform any maintenance or adjustments to them. If for any reason a piece of equipment becomes jammed, not launching targets correctly or not operating at all, please shut-off the machine immediately and advise the on-duty staff or our Equipment ManagerDO NOT attempt repair yourself please.

The range has several other fields from which to move to and continue your round. The Executive's job is to provide not only a fun shooting environment but a safe one and this cannot be accomplished if unqualified members are attempting their own repairs or adjustments to equipment.

So please abide by club policy and leave the repairs to our qualified, volunteer Director. Thank you for your cooperation.


