Membership Fee Increases—2024

As announced at AGM 2022, operating costs for the range continue to rise. These include utilities, targets, fuel, insurance coverage, amenities, as well as the lease from year to year.

It has come time now, to increase the membership fees that have remained at the current value since 2017. These increases will take effect for the 2024 season and release of applications for renewal as early as late Nov 2023.

It should be recognized that our membership continues to grow and is healthy with new members to the team. In fact in the last four years there has been a total of over 100 new members.

The Executive understands the reality of such increases that are out of our control but must action in order to continue operating effectively.

With our range being a not-for-profit

corporation that is federally registered, we must maintain the balance of operating costs and revenue, this is always a challenge. The fee increases are as follows:

Adult Membership: \$300 Family Membership: \$330

We thank all our members for their cooperation, understanding and loyalty to membership and the fun is always free!

Business Firearms Licence

The club has received it's first Business Firearms Licence which permits the club the sell only ammunition to shooters with valid firearm licences.


This is a great tool in our toolbox and ensure legalities are met. Shooters must provide their firearm licence number to the clubhouse staff when making purchase of the non-restricted ammunition.

All shooters must be in their possession of the licence at all times while

shooting at our range and providing that information to the volunteer kitchen staff is all that is required please.

The licence is proudly displayed behind glass in the display case at the clubhouse along with the other certificates of recognition.

Please adhere to the requirements to provide that information when you purchase any ammunition.


